Around the Clock

Chaska Officers issued 23 citations and 37 warnings during this reporting period. There were 180 calls for service

DWI:

Officer Pesheck observed a vehicle driving recklessly in the Chaska High School parking lot after 1:00 AM one morning. He made contact with the male driver, who was intoxicated and failed field sobriety evaluations. He was arrested and charged with DWI, open container and driving after suspension. A passenger was cited for possessing an open container of alcohol in a vehicle.

Disturbances:

Police responded to a domestic assault complaint at a residence. During an argument, a female punched her husband and threw numerous household items. She left the residence prior to police arrival, but returned a short time later. She was placed under arrest and charged with domestic assault and 5th degree assault.



A parked vehicle started on fire in the Super Target parking lot. The Chaska Fire Department extinguished the flames and the vehicle was towed from the lot. There were no injuries.

Three males became involved in a fight outside of a residence on Walnut Place. Police arrived and the three males were cited for disorderly conduct.

A female called police to report her gray cat had been missing after being outside, but was now at a female neighbor's residence. The female continued by saying her neighbor refused to return the cat to her. Officers spoke to the neighbor, who was adamant that the gray cat was hers and that the cat had run away during a "training session" approximately eight months prior. Both females were convinced the cat was theirs. Police arranged an intervention in order to resolve the dispute as both ladies were upset. During the intervention, the neighbor who found the cat discovered the gray cat was a male cat, not her missing gray female cat. Thanks to the gender-based evidence, the gray male cat was returned to his rightful owner and all was well in the world.
