DWI:

Police received a report of an erratic driver in the area of County Road 61 and Stoughton Avenue. An officer located and stopped the vehicle after observing dangerous driving conduct. The female driver was impaired and failed field sobriety evaluations. She was arrested and charged with 4th degree DWI.

Disturbances:

A male was arrested on multiple felony warrants at his residence. During the arrest, the male kicked an officer's leg and forcefully resisted being taken into custody. In addition to the warrant, the offender was charged with 4th degree assault and obstructing the legal process with force.

An intoxicated male, who was recently terminated from his job, was sitting outside his former place of employment. Police were called and responded to the scene. The male was located and was extremely inebriated. A breath test indicated a .287 BAC. He was transported to a hospital for a medical evaluation and placement into a detox facility.



A male driver called the police and reported he was the victim of a hit and run crash, which occurred in the area of Clover Ridge Drive and Engler Blvd. The male stated he had collided with a truck, which left the scene after causing damage to his vehicle. Investigation of the crash led police to discover the male had crashed into a tree, not another vehicle as he falsely purported. He was charged with hit and run (fixed object), filing a false police report and careless driving.
